The Power of Interprofessional Collaboration: Students Initiate UVA Chapter of IHI Open School

After attending a summer workshop hosted by the Academy for Emerging Leaders in Patient Safety, dedicated nursing and medical students returned with a mission: **Improve student engagement in ongoing Patient Safety and Quality Improvement (PSQI) efforts at UVA.** They initiated the UVA Chapter of the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) Open School, a student-led joint venture of the Schools of Nursing and Medicine.

The Chapter was initiated in the fall of 2017 by student leaders Kimone Reid (SON) and Pamela Moore (SOM) and mentored by faculty John Dent, MD. **“As budding healthcare professionals, we are learning how to work in teams to provide great care to our patients. iSERVE: Building interprofessional practice while serving the community

Since 2014, the Interprofessional Service, Education, Research & Volunteering Endeavor (iSERVE) has been providing free healthcare to underserved community members while promoting professional development and collaboration between nursing and medical students. Current activities include:

- ▶ Teaching health education and navigation at halfway facility Piedmont House
